About the Cabinetmakers' Autumn Exhibition:

The Cabinetmakers' Autumn Exhibition (SE) began in 1981 as a private organisation with a membership of some 72 designers and manufacturers and the purpose of forming networks within the field and creating an exhibition platform for experimental furniture. Thus, every year, SE stages a new and unique exhibition where furniture designers and manufacturers work together to create new furniture designs. For the past 28 years, the Cabinetmakers' Autumn Exhibition has been a recurring event which the field, the audience and furniture enthusiasts look forward to visiting, as this is where new furniture types see the light of day. Not as drafts on paper but as tangible and viable prototypes that are even ready for people to sit in. The usability and tangibility of the members' furniture are essential features of SE, as most furniture exhibitions do not allow the visitors to actually try out the exhibits. The Cabinetmakers' Autumn Exhibition usually revolves around a theme, which binds the designer and the manufacturer to a specific topic while simultaneously creating a space for free interpretation and for taking the furniture experiments in new and unpredictable directions. Few places in the world provide a similar professional playground for furniture designers and manufacturers. A playground that takes itself and its products seriously, and which does not let the furniture design be governed by commercial concerns. Over the years, SE has been a hatching ground for

future furniture classics. Nanna Ditzel's popular Trinidad Chair was created for SE, as were Poul Kjærholm's PK24, Mogens Koch's Folding Chair and Table, Wegner's Circle Chair, and Cecilie Manz' Mikado Table.

The Cabinetmakers' Autumn Exhibition is a private association, unaffiliated with other organisations, the government, and other stakeholders. The association's activities are funded by membership fees, while the exhibitions are based on contributions from charitable foundations. SE's network of designers and manufacturers is unique, considering Denmark's limited size. A network that requires openness and knowledge sharing between designers and manufacturers in an otherwise highly competitive commercial market. In addition to promoting high-quality experimental furniture designs, SE also promotes the members' prototypes on the SE web site which is said to be the largest prototype database in Europe. After the exhibition, the members often use their SE projects for profiling purposes in commercial trade fairs, which often helps the prototypes go into production.

The Cabinetmakers' Autumn Exhibition is under the patronage of HRH Crown Prince Frederik.
